"The Weapons of Our Warfare"

Part Eight

Text: 2 Corinthians 10:3-5/1 Corinthians 12:7-11

Intro: We now come to the last category of spiritual gifts that are found in 1 Corinthians 12- the Inspiration or verbal gifts. These gifts are: the gift of prophecy, tongues, and interpretation of tongues. These inspiration gifts are more directed to the church. In this lesson I want to talk about the gift of prophecy. Specifically, as with the other gifts, I want to define it, give some biblical examples of it, and finally, consider how to appropriate this gift into our lives and ministries.

- I. The definition of the gift of prophecy (1 Corinthians 14:3).
 - A. What the gift of prophecy is not:
 - 1. It is not foretelling the future.
 - a. The gift of prophecy is different from the office of a Prophet (Ephesians 4:11).
 - b. God has limited this gift to three specific exercises- edification or strengthening, exhortation or encouragement, and comfort.
 - 2. It is not to give guidance.
 - 3. It is not preaching.
 - a. Preaching is proclaiming the Good News.
 - b. This type of communication, though inspired and anointed by the Holy Spirit, comes from the natural mind.
 - c. Prophecy is the mind of the Holy Spirit and although some preaching may be infused with the gift of prophecy, preaching in and of itself is not.
 - 4. It is not used to rebuke. You will not find this in the three things that are listed in 1 Corinthians 14:3.
 - 5. It is not a ministry of criticism.
 - a. Prophecy is not one person's opinion against another.
 - b. This gift operates under the anointing of God to warn people of sin or shortcomings, it can lift Christians out of depression, and can encourage them to move from a place of Luke warmness.
 - B. The gift of prophecy is a message from God given spontaneously in the language understood by the people who are listening. It is a message that God is giving to His people.
 - 1. The gift of prophecy build up or strengthens people in their faith.
 - 2. The gift of prophecy exhorts or encourages people.
 - a. For example- a person may prophecy saying that Jesus is coming soon, don't give up the faith, don't stop now.
 - b. A person may prophecy saying that God has not forsaken you. Your difficulty is for just a little while.
 - 3. The gift of prophecy often comforts people in times of sorrow, distress, suffering, and persecution.
- II. Biblical Examples of the gift of prophecy.
 - A. It brings life. Prophecy brought life to the valley of dry bones (Ezekiel 37:1-4).
 - B. It encourages us and exhorts us by giving us a spiritual vision (Proverbs 29:13, 18).
 - C. Philip's daughters prophecied (Acts 21:9).
 - D. Peter declared that in the last days men and women, men servants and man servants would prophecy (Acts 2:18)

- III. How to appropriate this gift.
 - A. This is a gift that requires the Holy Spirit to work with or through you.
 - B. Understand that you are in control of this gift (1 Corinthians 14:29-33).
 - C. We prophecy according to the proportion of our faith.
 - 1. Romans 12:6.
 - 2. 2 Timothy 1:6
